Lakeside raises dough for charity

The squad teamed up with a few Southwest Airline pilots and raised more than \$10,000 to support the Innovative Clinical Trials Center at the Baylor Charles A. Sammons Cancer Center. In all, the event raised more than \$350,000 and had several hundred swimmers participate including many former Olympic swimmers.

In the one-mile swim, multiple LAC members finished ahead of the pack, including: David Arrendondo in second, Chase Sellers in third and Aidan Glynn in fifth. For the girls, Alex Sellers nabbed first, Abbie Porter claimed
